"Forgiveness not only begins first and foremost with God, but it also flows from God. In other words, forgiveness is of a divine nature and comes by divine power. "The priestly theology of the Old Testament appears to us at first glance as elitist and violent. Our worship experience is quite distant from the blood of numerous sacrifices performed by ornately dressed priests in a specifically designated holy place on certain consecrated days. On closer examination, though, we will gain profound theological insight and practical wisdom by studying these ancient priestly texts. Indeed, among many other things, we will come to a deeper appreciation and comprehension of the most important redemptive act of all, Jesus' death on the cross. After all, even a cursory reading of the Gospels and Epistles reveals that the significance of Jesus' death is painted in the colors of the tabernacle, priesthood, festivals, and sacrifices of the Old Testament."

"Thus, in the first part of the ritual involving the two goats, the death of the first goat symbolized the means of propitiating the wrath of God through the death of an innocent victim substituted in the sinner's place.
