Anything therefore that can instruct God's people in this matter is very welcome."

"The really odd thing...is not that the topic of revival is concerning evangelicals now, but that it has for so long failed to concern them, so much so that some find this renewed interest in it disconcerting and distasteful. The strange truth is that for the past hundred years although the churches, and evangelicalism within the churches, have been continuously losing ground, Christian people have not been longing for revival...This comparative unconcern about revival marks a break with the earlier evangelical outlook. For a century after the days of Whitefield and Jonathan Edwards, the immediate reaction of evangelicals when the fires of life burned low in the churches was to appoint times for self-humbling and confession of sin and special prayer that God would visit them again. They regarded revivals as the chief means by which the gospel advanced; they believed, and often declared in print, that without revivals churches could not stay alive."
